We could exhaust ourselves on the time the NT says something like: "as it is written" or "as Scripture says" Clearly our understanding of the NT is dependent upon our knowing and understanding the OT.

Consider/read 1Cor.10:1-22 (verse 6 "Now these things took place as examples for us, that we might not desire evil as they did." And verse 11 "Now these things happened to them as an example, but they were written down for our instruction, on whom the end of the ages has come.")

The value of what we are currently reading is intimately connected to these passages, and some future ones, to help us understand what God was doing and why He was doing them: Heb.8:1-9:28 (especially 8:8 and 9:9) also Heb12:18-29
