9-5-2022 2Kg.7:3-20; 2Kg.8:7-15; 2Kg.13:14-21; 2Kg.13:24-25; 2Kg.13:12-13; 2Kg.14:15-16; 2Kg.14:23; 2Kg.14:17-20; 2Chr.25:25-28; 2Kg.14:21-22; 2Kg.15:1-5; 2Chr.26:1-21; Amos 1:1-15 **Question:** What did Elisha die from? **Answer:** 2Kg.13:14,20

- 2Kg.7:3-20 The end of the siege against Samaria - God's doing, not man
- 2Kg.8:7-15 The first phase of fulfillment of the prophecy of Elijah (1Kg.19:15-18)
- 2Kg.13:14-21 The last moments of Elisha
- 2Kg.13:24-25 Kingdom of Aram transfers from Haziel to Ben-Hadad his son
- 2Kg.13:24-25 Recovery of some territory from Ben-Hadad by Israel's king Jehohash
- 2Kg.13:12-13/14:15-16, 23 Jehohash succeeded by Jeroboam
- 2Kg.14:17-20/2Chr.25:25-28/2Kg.14:21-22 Amaziah king of Judah killed, his son Azariah at 16 takes his place
- 2Kg.15:1-5/2Chr.26:1-21 Azariah(Uzziah) reigned 52 years but his later years were troubled by disease from not following God - He thought he should be able to enter the temple, he was wrong
- Amos1:1-15 Amos shows up and begins his assignment during King Uzziah/Azariah of Judah and King Jeroboam of Israel

• Amos contains some repetitive phrases "for three...even four", "This is what the Lord says"

9-6-2022 Amos 2:1-6:14 **Question:** What does Amos 3:6 mean? **Answer:** **Question:** What would be a reasonable application in our time? **Answer:**

- 2:1-3 Judgment against Moab; 2:4-5 Against Judah; 2:-6-16 Against Israel
- 3:1-15 Israel's guilt and their punishments
- 3:6-7 Does this have any application to 9-11 event in our time?
- 4:1-13 God's corrective hand brings little result
- 5:1-27 Seek the Lord and live, Oh if only you would
- 6:1-14 God can not continue to tolerate Israel's pride and stubborn rebellion - destruction and exile in their future

9-7-2022 Amos 7:1-9:15; Hosea 1:1-3:5 **Question:** So what was Amos before the Lord sent him with words of warning? **Answer:** Am.7:14-15 and Am.1:1

- Amos.7:1-17 Words against king Jeroboam of Israel refuted and rejected, Amos forbidden to prophecy, Amos responds - doom and exile
- Amos.8:1-14 God shows Amos more future events including a day that turns to night at noon
- Amos.9:1-15 Judgments declared, Israel destroyed but a future restoration
- Hosea 1:1-11 Hosea called to prophecy by marriage and naming of his children
- Hosea 2:1-23 God speaks harsh words and in them a word of a future return to God

- Hosea 3:1-5 Hosea called to take back his adulterous wife, again showing God's example through him

9-8-2022 Hosea 4:1-5:7; 2Kg.14:24-28; Jonah 1:1-4:11; 2Kg 14:29; 2Kg.15:8-12; 2Kg.15:13-16 **Question:** What charge did the Lord have to bring against Israel through Hosea? **Answer:** Hosea.4:1-2

- Hosea 4:1-19 very descriptive words from God of guilty actions and the consequential judgments
- Hosea 4:1-3 How can the heathen of today expect the land to flourish when they are guilty of the cause of destruction by their own wickedness?
- Hosea.5:1-7 Final words of judgment against Israel
- 2Kg.14:24-28 Jeroboam the 2nd becomes king and because of God's own mercy does not destroy Israel entirely
- Jonah 1:1-17 Jonah's assignment, his fleeing God and subsequent fish food experience
- Jonah 2:1-10 Jonah's song/prayer/psalm from inside the fish
- Jonah 3:1-10 Jonah enters Nineveh and preaches God's message - they humbly repent, Jonah angry
- Jonah 4:1-11 God teaches Jonah a lesson about mercy and Godly reasoning
- 2Kg.14:29; 2Kg.15:8-16 The fast paste transition between rulers of Israel: Jeroboam to son Zechariah to Shallum an assassin who takes the throne ending the 4 generation reign of Jehu -

Prophecy fulfilled, Shallum then assassinated my Menahem

9-9-2022 2Kg.15:17-20; 1Chr.5:23-26; 2Kg.15:6-7; 2Chr.26:22-23; 2Kg.15:21-29; Isa.6:1-13; 2Kg.15:32-38; 2Chr.27:1-9; 1Chr.5:11-17; 2Kg.16:1-9; 2Chr.28:1-21 **Question:** Obed the prophet told Israel to do or not to do what? **Answer:**

- 2Kg.15:17-20 and 2Kg.15:6-7 and 2Chr.26:22-23 The end of Azariah and his Son Jotham succeeds
- 1Chr.5:23-26 The fate of the tribe of Manasseh
- 2Kg.15:21-29 Menahem succeeded by son Pekahiah reigns, he is assassinated by his general Pekah
- Isa.6:1-13 Isaiah's commission the year Uzziah died, the destruction and judgment shown him
- 2Kg.15:32-38/2Chr.27:1-9 Jotham's rules Judah
- 1Chr.5:11-17 Gad's genealogy recorded during Jotham's reign
- 2Kg.16:1-9/2Chr.28:1-21 Ahaz's reigns over Judah - behaves foolishly, judgment comes, prophet Obed intervenes with success (His words headed)
