

## Week # 37 Casual Observations

**9-12-2022** Isa.7:1-10:4; Isa.17:1-14 **Question:** If God could whistle, what would He whistle for?

**Answer:** Isa.7:18-19

- Isa.7:1-7 "If you are not firm in faith, you will not be firm at all." (explain) Who knew Isaiah had a son? Shear-jashub
- Isa.7:10-25 The sign of Immanuel (14-16)
- Isa.8:1-4 The prophetess bears a child - Maher-shalal-hash-baz = "Make speed to the spoil—Hasten to the prey" Is this child the sign of Immanuel?
- Isa.8:5-10 God speaks again, oddly the name Immanuel (God with us) shows up a second time, its third and last time is Mat.1:23.
- Isa.8:11-22 God speaks again - Fear God, Wait for the Lord
- Isa.9:1-7 (2, 6-7) Unto us a child is born
- Isa.9:8-10:4 Judgment against arrogance and oppression
- Isa.17:1-14 An oracle concerning Damascus

**9-13-2022** Hosea 5:8-7:16; 2Kg.16:10-18; 2Chr.28:22-25; 2Kg.15:30-31; 2Kg.17:1-2; Hosea 8:1-9:17 **Question:** So what does Hosea say a prophet is like? **Answer:** Hos.6:5 (?)

- Hos.5:8-15 (5:1-15) Judgment against Israel

- Hos.6:1-7:16 Israel unrepentant
- 2Kg.16:10-18/2Chr.28:22-25 Ahaz builds a new altar like Assyria, how wrong was this?
- 2Kg.15:30-31/2Kg.17:1-2 Hoshea assassinates Pekah and takes the throne of Israel
- Hos.8:1-14 Sow the wind, reap the whirlwind, Israel rejects God's many good laws
- Hos.9:1-17 Israel will be homeless in Egypt, in Assyria, a price for unfaithfulness/prostitution

**9-14-2022** Hosea 10:1-12:14; Hosea 13:1-14:9; Micah 1:1-7 **Question:** What do the rebellious stumble over? **Answer:** Hos.14:9

- Hos.10:1-15 Israel's many sins - Ephraim will be destroyed. (12 a call to return but who hears?)
- Hos.11:1-11 God's relentless love
- Hos.11:12-12:14 Ephraim/Israel, their origins reviewed in Jacob, their sin/wickedness visited
- Hos.13:1-16 Ephraim has fallen a long way, rebelled against their helper - there is hope (14)
- Hos.14:1-9 Repentance will bring restoration
- Mic.1:1-7 God's words - The Lord is coming...

**9-15-2022** 2Kg.17:3-23; 2Kg.18:9-12; 2Kg.17:24-41; Isa.5:1-30; 2Kg.16:19-20; 2Chr.28:26-27; 2Kg.18:1-2; 2Chr.29:1; 1Chr.4:34-43 **Question:** What are the "woe to those..." all about? **Answer:** Isa.5:18-23 **Question:** How many are there? **Answer:** Isa.5:18,20,21

- 2Kg.17:3-23 A review of Israel's sin history, the cause of their being taken into exile (see 16-17)
- 2Kg.18:9-12 Time stamp - from Hezekiah's 4<sup>th</sup> - 6<sup>th</sup> year Samaria was sieged and captured and carried off in the 7<sup>th</sup>
- 2Kg.17:24-41 Assyria settles other peoples in Samaria - they have to be taught about God - They only partly worship Him. Interesting mix
- Isa.5:1-30 God always speaks through His prophets, this time by Isaiah - a comparative parable
- 2Kg.16:19-20/2Chr.28:26-27/2Kg.18:1-2  
2Chr.29:1 Ahaz dies and his son Hezekiah takes his place (he is 25 and will reign 29 years)
- 1Chr.4:34-43 A history of Simeon's descendents at the time of Hezekiah's reign

**9-16-2022** Isa.13:1-16:14 **Question:** A glimpse of Satan (Lucifer) is seen in what verses and what would make you think the passages are about him?

**Answer:** Isa.14:12-21

- Isa.13:1-22 Words concerning judgment, God's tool - the Medes and Babylon
- Isa.14:1-32 Several short prophecies
- Isa.14:1-2 The Lord turn the tables;
- Isa.14:3-23 (what else or who else is being spoken about besides the king of Persia?)
- Isa.14:24-27 The Lord has sworn, so shall it be

- Isa.14:28-32 An oracle against Philistines
- Isa.15:1-9 An oracle against Moab
- Isa.16:1-13 More words, a rebuke against Moab, 13 is an addendum - within 3 years you will be destroyed
